I don't agree with Colbert I. King's assertion in his March 11 op-ed, "<u>D.C. home</u> <u>rule takes an unnecessary hit</u>," that congressional interference in D.C. in 1995, resulting in the imposition of a fiscal control board, was justified. He pointed out the city at that time was a mismanaged financial mess. Yet many other cities, including Detroit and Philadelphia, were in similar straits and did not warrant a federal takeover. There is no legitimate reason for interfering with Washingtonians' right to self-govern. Giving credibility to any act that violates our right to equal citizenship legitimizes congressional interference and engenders a benign acceptance.
